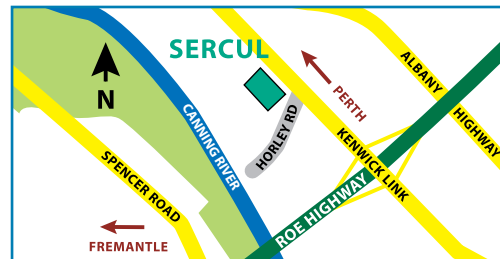

Develop and assist community, State and Local Government in the coordination of Natural Resource Management in the South Region.

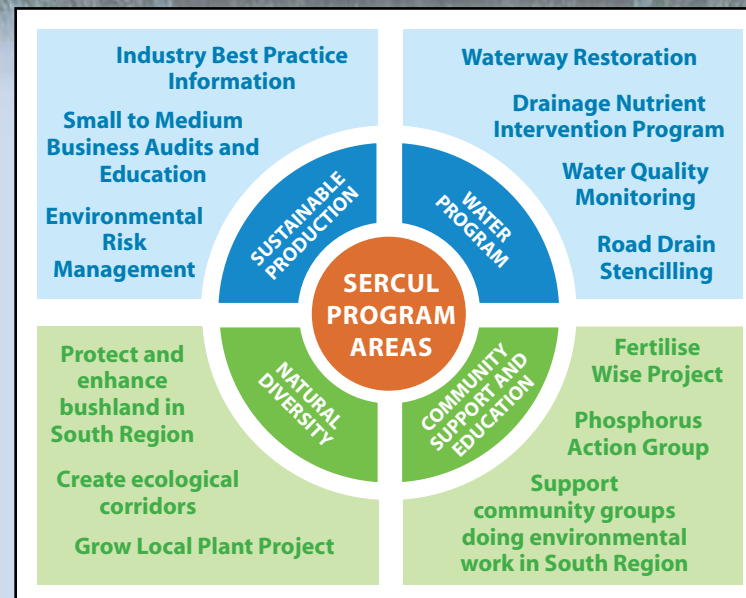
Support and encourage the implementation of best management practice of Natural Resources within the South Region.

### HOW YOU CAN HELP

Everyone can help our environment by living in a manner that reduces our negative impact, or footprint. It is simply a matter of changing some behaviours like:

- Use less chemicals
- Use phosphorus free and water wise products in and around the home
- Use the right fertiliser at the right time (Fertilise Wise)
- Plant local plants in your garden which will increase biodiversity
- Consider alternatives to lawn
- Wash your car on the lawn and not on the driveway
- Pick up after your dog
- Don't feed bread to waterbirds
- Don't let anything from your property go down street drains
- Get involved with your local catchment or Friends of Group
