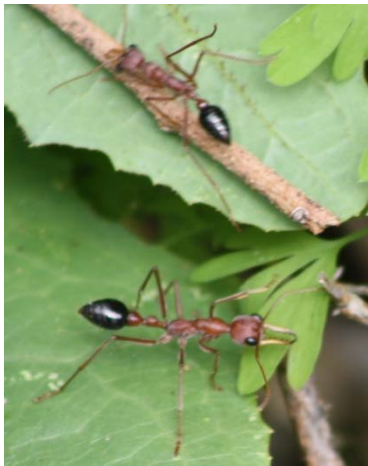

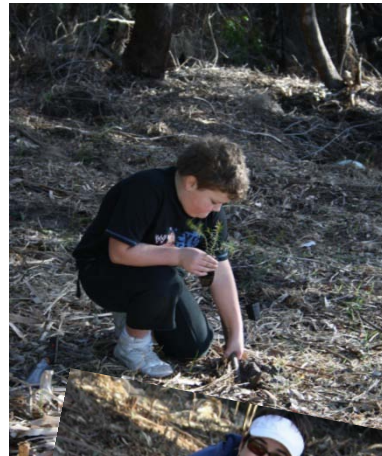

***Saturday August 28th 9 – 11am Water discovery**

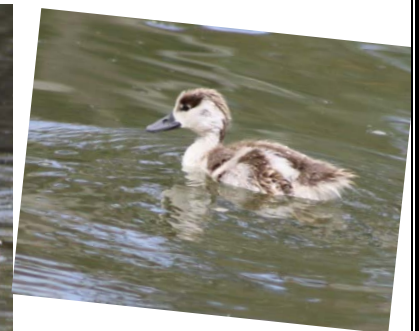
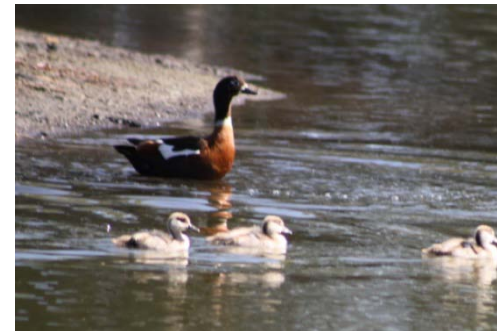
Wow ! a fantastic morning unfortunately too sunny for us to see our frogs around the lake – take an early morning walk or evening and they are a calling.

Amy showed 31 adults + children bottled local frogs, listened to their calls and then we looked at their habitat.

We followed up by looking for Macro invertebrates in the water - 9 macros found



Mary Carroll Lake is alive with new life – go for a walk out on the walk way (near car park)– not only are flowering plants coming into flower but a lot of our waterbirds have young.
