The South East Regional Centre for Urban Landcare Inc (SERCUL) is looking for people to join its Executive Committee who have a strong interest in landcare and conservation and skills/experience in management, finance or business development.

SERCUL is an independent community organisation established in 2003 that works with State and local government, community, business and educational institutions to plan, develop and implement projects and programs to improve the natural environment of the Perth metropolitan area, particularly the southern and eastern suburbs. The Centre's staff work in landcare and restoration, environmental education, research and monitoring, community partnership development, and administration, reporting to a chief executive officer. Among SERCUL's achievements last year were engaging with more than 18,000 people through community work days and Friends groups; working with nearly 70 schools and conducting since 2005 the most comprehensive local government waterway sampling in Perth at nearly 90 sites. SERCUL staff can be found on landscape and restoration projects ranging from Nedlands to Cockburn and from Armadale to Fremantle.

SERCUL's Executive Committee determines and monitors the implementation of the Centre's strategic directions. The responsibilities of Executive Committee members are not onerous: preparing for and participating in 11 meetings a year which go for 1 ½ to 2 hours as well as some ad hoc out-of-session input into policy and management decisions. The CEO and senior staff provide strong support to the Executive Committee through comprehensive reporting to the monthly meetings.

The Executive Committee meets on the 4th Monday of every month, 9am – 11am.
